1<sup>st</sup> Week of Advent. Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December. Readings: Isaiah 2:1-5; Psalm: 121; Matthew 8:5-11.

We begin Advent with a journey theme. We are invited to journey to the mountain of the Lord. In the Gospel the story is of paralysis being overcome. The journey motif will haunt us throughout our liturgical year, climaxing in the Lenten, Exodus journey. This reminds us that our liturgy is not just something to watch but is meant to empower us, draw us forward in hope.
