Thoughts on the Daily Word

3rd Week of Year. Friday 31st January. Readings of Day: Hebrews 10:32-39; Psalm: 36; Gospel: Mark 4:26-34.

We live in times rather like that of the early Church. Christians are now a small number, a remnant, in most societies. In Britain we live in one of the most secular countries in the West, if not the whole world. This can seem depressing as we live among the ruins of centuries of Christian civilisation. However, we can take heart as we are still in the beginning of our catechumenate time when we are learning again, just like the early Christians who developed this process, what Church is all about.
